

Fonroche Lighting wins the solar lighting tender from Paris Airports

Agen, October 17, 2023. Fonroche Lighting, a global leader in solar public lighting, has just won the tender launched by the ADP Group (Paris Airports). This contract involves the supply of solar streetlights for the various platforms managed by the ADP Group, which operates the three main Parisian airports: Paris-Charles de Gaulle, Paris-Orly, and Paris-Le Bourget, as well as 12 general aviation aerodromes. This 3-year contract represents nearly 2000 Fonroche Lighting solar streetlights.

As the principal developer and airport operator in Paris, the ADP Group issued a tender for the supply of solar streetlights to renovate its lighting infrastructure and offer more efficient and sustainable equipment. The French company, Fonroche Lighting, already well-established in France and globally recognized for the quality of its products, has won this contract. Within the next 3 years, it will install several hundred solar streetlights manufactured at its industrial site located in Lot-et-Garonne. By partially directing its lighting policy toward solar technology, the ADP Group aims to achieve immediate savings and commit to ecological and sustainable solutions for future generations. These streetlights will illuminate several parking lots, roads, and technical areas across different airport zones within the group.
